





1 year	2017	1%
10 years	2014-2024	10%
20 years	2014-2034	18%
30 years	2014-2044	26%
50 years	2014-2064	40%
70 years	2014-2084	51%


#### **Historical Flooding Reference**

2. Continue supporting the development of the Springbank Offstream Reservoir on the Elbow River by the Province;





- 32 communities evacuated
- 80,000+ people directly impacted
- 1000's of homes damaged or destroyed
- 4000 businesses affected
- 24,000 truckloads of flood waste
- 5.1 million hours lost in private sector productivity
- 1.8 billion dollars in direct damages alone
- 5 lives lost in Calgary and surrounding areas


